A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear SSC Members,

Another ski season has been completed in the northern hemisphere and my skis have been carefully stored after applying an off-season waxing. As we transition out of the 2023 ski season, we also introduce a new Executive Board for Suburban Ski Club with our March elections. I believe you have installed a very capable and enthusiastic Board for the 2023-24 season - and (after a hard-fought campaign!) I am excited to assume the role of your President.

For those who may not know me, I have been a skier since 11 years of age, starting on wooden skis with bear trap/non-release bindings and double lace leather boots — but I am happy to report that I have kept up with a few

generations of equipment advancement over the decades.

I also have a long-standing history of participation in year-round outdoor activities including Nordic skiing, ice-hockey, wilderness camping/canoe tripping and tennis. Football (soccer for the American crowd) is also a love of mine, and although no longer playing or coaching, I continue to referee both High School and USSF games. Professionally my career included 35 years on Staff in Cardiology at the Cleveland Clinic, a position I retired from 5 years ago to free up more time to enjoy my avocational interests (see above).

But in addition to my biographical information, what is most important for this message is how I see the status and future of Suburban Ski Club. I believe the Club is in excellent condition thanks to the efforts of out-going President, **Tracy Blake** and the other Executive Board members. We are strong both membership-wise and in our fiscal position.

As we continue to emerge from the COVID epidemic and all the associated personal/social trials and adjustments, we look forward to an ongoing and enthusiastic return to SSC activities, on and off the snow. (Be sure to read the monthly Newsletters and check out the Club's web page for upcoming events.)

Looking to the 2024 ski season, we will once again be offering two western trips and an eastern trip. We will be going to **Big Sky**, **MT**, **January 20 - 27**, **Whitefish**, **MT**, **March 9 - 16**, and **Sunday River**, **ME**, **February 11 - 17**. The Executive Board is meeting this month to finalize details. We expect to announce pricing and all the other specifics in the June 1st newsletter. For now, you can anticipate that Big Sky's price will be the highest, Whitefish will fall in the middle range and Sunday River will offer its usual all-inclusive trip at the lowest price.

The Club will also be offering local day bus trips. Since the start of COVID participation in the day bus trips has been down but we were able to continue these outings via co-sponsorship with the Lewis Ski Club. A strategy we are likely to continue in 2024. We are also investigating alternate day bus trip options and we would like to be able to return to independently sponsored SSC trips based on the participation of our members. So, get involved and sign-up this season to demonstrate we can support our own bus.

As noted earlier our membership is solid at approximately 200 but our ongoing success depends on active members. The Executive Board is studying strategies to augment membership volume but, as always, the Club depends on current members to invite/promote membership. If you have a work colleague or social friend interested in skiing, invite them to participate in a club function and leave the planning/driving/flying to us – and be sure to point out to them the reduced cost for lift tickets and other expenses that come with our group rates.

Speaking of new members, we enthusiastically welcome: Carl Femc and K.C. Flynn.

Thanks for your time to read this message. I look forward to your support, input and involvement, but for now get outside and enjoy the Spring weather, until the snow flies again!


