A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear SSC Members,

It's great to live in Cleveland and to ski....but we need more snow....and that latter fact is true for most of the country! According to the "On the Snow" website: Utah is sitting at 74% of average snowpack, with Colorado at 51%, Montana at 36% and Cleveland at 45% of average snowfall. To have a below average snowfall when your annual levels are between 150-250 inches is one thing but when Cleveland only receives an average of 44 inches annual snowfall by this point of the season that tallies out to only 19.8 inches of snow this winter...and none of that is still on the ground today! To date, this has been one of our lowest snowfalls on record.

Despite the low snowfall levels, we have had some very positive events. Our first major trip to **Big Sky, MT** was a huge success. The trip was a sell-out, the mountain fantastic and the socialization amazing. Big thumbs up to Trip Leader **Ann McBrian** for making sure everything ran smoothly! The only thing we wanted more of was snow.

Our second major trip to **Sunday River, Maine** was marred by an unfortunate skiing injury to Trip Leader/Organizer and <u>Ski Trails</u> Editor, **Joe Sullivan**, at Peek n Peak the week before the trip departed. (Our wishes go out to Joe for a full recovery and return to the slopes next season). In true Suburban Ski Club fashion several members stepped up to ensure the trip was a success with **Beth Silverman** and **Tracy Blake** assuming the roles of Co-trip Leaders (Note that it took two to fill in for Joe). Thanks to Beth and Tracy for their services!

Last month we published a group photo of the Big Sky contingent, and check later in this newsletter(see page 6) for a photo of the Sunday River group. We have plans

to memorialize the Big Sky and Sunday River trips in a future special issue of <u>Ski</u> Trails.

Unfortunately, we had to cancel three of our day trips to Holiday Valley this season. One because of mechanical issues with the bus and two because of poor ski conditions and low sign-up.

We are looking to close out our current season with another successful, sold-out major trip heading to Whitefish MT, March 9 -16. Trip Leader **June Kelley** has already held her pre-trip meeting with participants. Everyone has their travel packet/itinerary and should be about to start packing.



Monday, Apri 18: Suburban Ski Club Eclipse Party on the Lake

The following is the text of an Email sent to the SSC membership by **Cliff Lewis**. It contains information about the party and some important details for the special glasses needed. Please also see the **flyer for the eclipse party** attached to the Email that brought you this newsletter.

We are preparing a flyer for an eclipse viewing party for SSC members at Fran Wesley's lakefront home in Sheffield Lake on Monday, April 8. You probably know that there will be a total eclipse on that date, centered right here over the Cleveland area. For many of us, this will likely be our only opportunity to see a total eclipse in our lifetimes. Details will be available soon.

Whether you come to the party or have other plans, it is essential that you have eclipse glasses for safe viewing of the sun during the eclipse. The American Astronomical Society (AAS) has a web page listing suppliers of glasses that meet the safety requirements of the ISO 12312-2 international standard. See https://eclipse.aas.org/eye-safety/viewers-filters for the list.

Eclipse glasses are going to be in high demand, so it is important to get yours as soon as possible. One of the listed sites is https://www.eclipseovercleveland.com, which sells glasses and also lists some local stores that sell them. It is a good idea to call ahead and make sure the stores still have them. Some organizations like libraries, museums, and the Cleveland Metroparks offer them too.

Important: The AAS page recommend NOT buying your glasses from large online sites like Amazon, eBay, or Temu unless you can make sure that (1) the seller is identified on the site and (2) the seller is listed on the AAS page. Unfortunately, a large number of counterfeit glasses tend to pop up on those sites before eclipses.

(FYI, I bought mine from https://bookishbunnyglasses.com/collections/all. Kind of an odd site offering other products that are totally unrelated to eclipse glasses. But it was listed on the AAS page. I opted for a pack of 3 plastic-frame glasses for \$18.99. It looks like the price has gone up to \$20.99)

2024 BUS TRIPS

Dear SSC Members,

Although we have one exciting major trip to Whitefish coming up this month our bus trip program ended with a whimper. You may have heard that our last bus trip with the Lewis Ski Club did not come off because of a snafu with the bus company. Then the last two trips on our smaller bus needed to be canceled because of a combination of poor skiing conditions and low registration.

What is left? You may still be able to find some snow at Boston Mills or Alpine Valley, but I want to tell you about another opportunity at Holiday Valley (HV). We have been able to negotiate a special discounted price for members of Suburban Ski Club. Our current club rates at HV are:

Weekend/Holiday:\$67/50adult/jr.

Weekday: \$47/37 adult/jr.

Two days: \$120weekend, \$82 weekday

These are ALL-DAY lift tickets

But beginning <u>Monday March 11th</u>, Holiday Valley will start giving our club an even bigger discount deal of \$40 for an all-day ticket. That's for both weekends and weekdays.

<u>To Buy Your Tickets</u>: When you get to HV, go into the **Group Sales Building** (it's the building to the right of the Main Lodge). DO NOT go to one of the lift ticket windows, or to one of the other lodges. You have to go to **Group Sales**. Ask for **Scott**, (but anyone behind the counter will be able to help you). It is important to tell them you are with Suburban Ski club and want our discount. Make sure you thank them!

Since the bus trip program is ending, this may be my last article for a while. But I want you to know we are already beginning our plans for 2025. The Executive Board has already begun discussing destinations for major trips and they will soon also talk about the bus trip program. So, I am inviting you to contact me to express your ideas, suggestions and criticisms about day trips.
